When I was a little girl, I knew that one day I would be an artist. To accomplish this end, I went to the University of Manitoba School of Art. During those same years, I studied piano.

Here I am today performing STORMING HEAVEN in a Theatre. And yet, I do not consider my work to be "theatre", or for that matter, that I am an actress. In this context, I am a "Performance Artist".

What I am doing is not in the least obscure. The emotions I portray are basic, and can thus be felt by anyone-despite language or cultural barriers. The persona I portray is a facet of myself rather than an assumed role.

I consider the Visual Components of STORMING HEAVEN to be works of art capable of standing alone. They are not mere
